

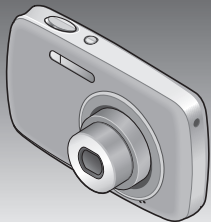

About the battery pack

Battery charger

This battery charger operates on AC between 110 V and 240 V.

But

- In the U.S.A. and Canada, the battery charger must be connected to a 120 V AC power supply only.
- When connecting to an AC supply outside of the U.S.A. or Canada, use a plug adaptor to suit the AC outlet configuration.

■ Cautions for Use

- Always use a genuine Panasonic AV cable (DMW-AVC1: optional).
- Do not use any other USB connection cables except the supplied one.

Keep the camera as far away as possible from electromagnetic equipment (such as microwave ovens, TVs, video games etc.).

- If you use the camera on top of or near a TV, the pictures and sound on the camera may be disrupted by electromagnetic wave radiation.
- Do not use the camera near cell phones because doing so may result in noise adversely affecting the pictures and sound.
- Recorded data may be damaged, or pictures may be distorted, by strong magnetic fields created by speakers or large motors.
- Electromagnetic wave radiation generated by microprocessors may adversely affect the camera, disturbing the pictures and sound.
- If the camera is adversely affected by electromagnetic equipment and stops functioning properly, turn the camera off and remove the battery or disconnect AC adaptor (DMW-AC5PP; optional). Then reinsert the battery or reconnect AC adaptor and turn the camera on.

● In this manual, the button that is used is shaded or indicated by ▲▼◀▶.

- Always use a genuine Panasonic AC adaptor (DMW-AC5PP; optional).
- When using an AC adaptor, ensure that the Panasonic DC coupler (DMW-DCC10; optional) and AC adaptor (DMW-AC5PP; optional) are used.
- If the power supply is cut off due to a power cut or the AC adaptor being disconnected, the motion picture being recorded using the AC adaptor will not be recorded.
- Some tripods or unipods, and some methods of holding the camera may block the speaker, making it difficult to hear the beep, etc.

Charging the battery

■ About batteries that you can use with this unit

The batteries that can be used with this unit are NCA-YN101G (supplied) and DMW-BCK7PP (optional).

It has been found that counterfeit battery packs which look very similar to the genuine products are made available to purchase in some markets. Some of these battery packs are not adequately protected with internal protection to meet the requirements of appropriate safety standards. There is a possibility that these battery packs may lead to fire or explosion. Please be advised that we are not liable for any accident or failure occurring as a result of use of a counterfeit battery pack. To ensure that safe products are used we recommend that a genuine Panasonic battery pack is used.

- Use the dedicated charger and battery.
- The battery is not charged when the camera is shipped. Charge the battery and set the clock before use.
- Charge the battery with the charger indoors (10 °C to 30 °C) (50 °F to 86 °F).

1 Insert the battery terminals and attach the battery to the charger

Ensure [LUMIX] faces outwards.



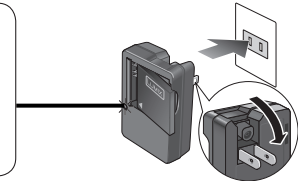

Recording conditions by CIPA standard

- CIPA is an abbreviation of [Camera & Imaging Products Association].
- [Normal Picture] Mode
- Temperature: 23 °C (73.4 °F)/Humidity: 50 %RH when LCD monitor is on.
- Using a Panasonic SD Memory Card (32 MB).
- Using the supplied battery.
- Starting recording 30 seconds after the camera is turned on. (When the Optical Image Stabilizer function is set to [ON].)
- Recording once every 30 seconds with full flash every second recording.
- Perform a zoom operation every recording (W end → T end, or T end → W end)
- Turning the camera off every 10 recordings and leaving it until the temperature of the battery decreases.

The number of recordable pictures or available operating time may vary according to surrounding environment and usage conditions. Figures may be reduced if flash, zoom, or other functions are used frequently, or in colder climates.

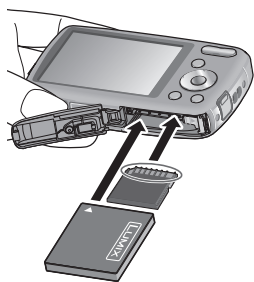
Inserting and removing the card (optional)/the battery

- 1 Turn off the power and slide the card/battery door out (1) before opening the door (2) as illustrated



- 2 Insert the battery and card, making sure that their orientation is correct

- Battery: Insert all the way firmly until a locking sound is heard, and check that the lever is hooked over the battery.
- Card: Insert all the way firmly until it clicks.



- 3 Close the card/battery door and slide the door in until you hear a locking sound

■ To remove

- To remove battery: move lever in direction of arrow.



- To remove card: press down in center.



- Always use genuine Panasonic batteries (NCA-YN101G: supplied or DMW-BCK7PP: optional).
- If you use other batteries, we cannot guarantee the quality of this product.
- Insert the card fully, otherwise it may be damaged.

Picture save destination (cards and built-in memory)

■ Built-in memory (DMC-S3: Approx. 70 MB/DMC-S1: Approx. 20 MB)

- The built-in memory can be used as a temporary storage device when the card being used becomes full.
- The access time for the built-in memory may be longer than the access time for a card.

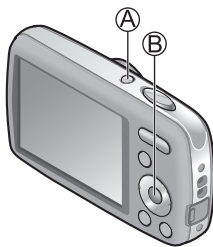

Setting the clock

The clock is not set when the camera is shipped.

- 1 Press the Power button (A)**
[Please set the clock] is displayed.
- 2 Press [MENU/SET] (B)**
- 3 Press ◀▶ to select the items (year, month, day, hour, minute, display order or time display format), and press ▲▼ to set**
 - To cancel → Press [⏪ / ⏩].
- 4 Press [MENU/SET]**
- 5 Confirm the setting and press [MENU/SET]**
 - To return to the previous screen, press [⏪ / ⏩].
 - Turn on the power again and check the time display.

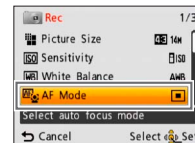

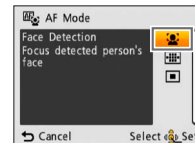

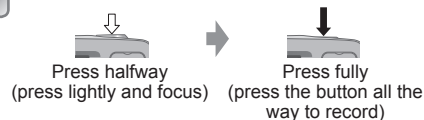
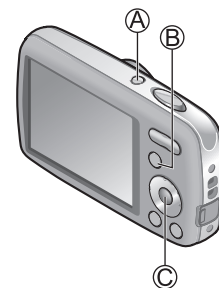
Taking pictures with automatic settings

[Intelligent Auto] Mode

Recording Mode: 

Optimum settings are made automatically from information such as “face,” “movement,” “brightness,” and “distance” just by pointing the camera at the subject, meaning that clear pictures can be taken without the need to make settings manually.

- 1 Press the Power button (A)**
The power is turned on.
- 2 Press the [MODE] button (B)**
- 3 Press ▲▼◀▶ to select [Intelligent Auto] Mode**
- 4 Press [MENU/SET] (C)**
- 5 Take pictures**



- If jitter becomes noticeable, use both hands, keep your arms close to your body, and stand with your feet at shoulder width.
- **Focus display (D)**
(In focus: lit / Not in focus: flashing)
- The AF area (E) is displayed around the subject's face by the Face Detection function. In other cases, it is displayed at the point on the subject which is in focus.
- Focus: Max. W: 5 cm (0.17 feet)/
Max. T: 1 m (3.28 feet) and above











Taking pictures with automatic settings



[Intelligent Auto] Mode (Continued)

Recording Mode: 

Automatic Scene Detection





Camera identifies scene when pointed at the subject, and makes optimum settings automatically. The type of scene detected is indicated by a blue icon for two seconds.

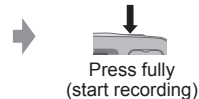
If the camera automatically identifies the scene and determines that people appear as subjects in the picture ( or ) , Face Detection is activated, and the focus and exposure are adjusted for the recognized faces.

Taking motion pictures [Motion Picture] Mode

Recording Mode: 

- 1 Press the [MODE] button
- 2 Press     to select [Motion Picture] Mode
- 3 Press [MENU/SET]

- 4 Start recording



- 5 End recording

- The focus and zoom will remain as they were at the beginning of recording.
- Immediately release the shutter button after pressing it all the way.
- When there is no space left to store the motion picture, recording automatically ends.
- Motion pictures can be recorded continuously up to 2 GB. To record more than 2 GB, press the shutter button again. (Remaining time for continuous recording is displayed on the screen.)

1 Press the Playback button (A)



2 Press   to select the picture



- To play back a motion picture, select an image with  or , and then press  to start playback.
- Be careful not to block the speaker.
- You can print pictures by connecting a camera to your computer or printer, or by giving an SD card to a shop assistant at a photo shop.

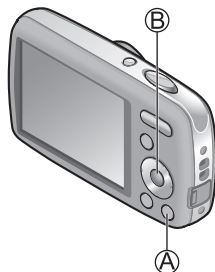
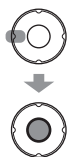

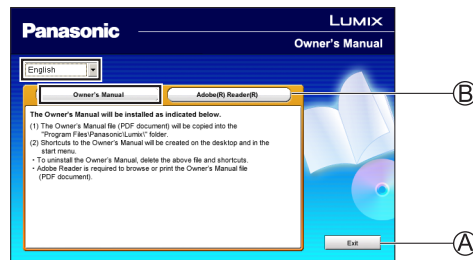
