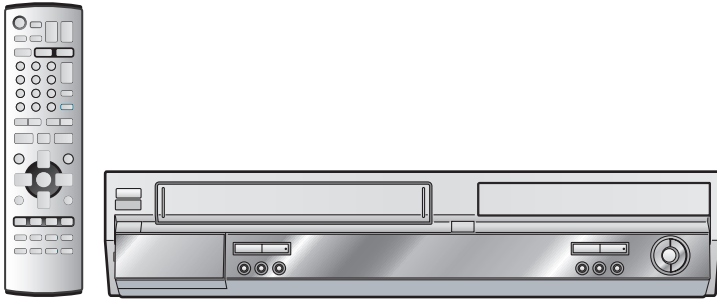

## Useful features

You can enjoy both VHS and DVD with this unit.

This DVD Video recorder records high quality images to rapid random access capable DVD-RAM media. This has resulted in many new features that outperform older tape formats. The following information summarizes a few of these features.

### Instant play (→ 21, 33)

There is no need to rewind or search forward. Direct Navigator guides you to the beginning of the recorded video immediately.

### Instant recording (→ 26)

You no longer need to search for empty disc space. By pressing the recording button, the unit finds available recording space and begins recording right away. There is no need to worry about overwriting already recorded content.

### Chasing playback (→ 25)

There is no need to wait until recording is complete. Without stopping recording, you can play the video currently being recorded from its beginning.

### Simultaneous Recording and Play (→ 25)

While recording, you can play another video program that was recorded previously.

### Time Slip (→ 23, 25)

During play and also while recording, you can jump to the scene you wish to view by specifying the skip time.

### One touch dubbing (→ 58, 60)

Memorable contents on VHS can be easily dubbed onto DVD. “One touch 2-way Transfer/Dubbing” enables you to copy from VHS to DVD and vice versa.

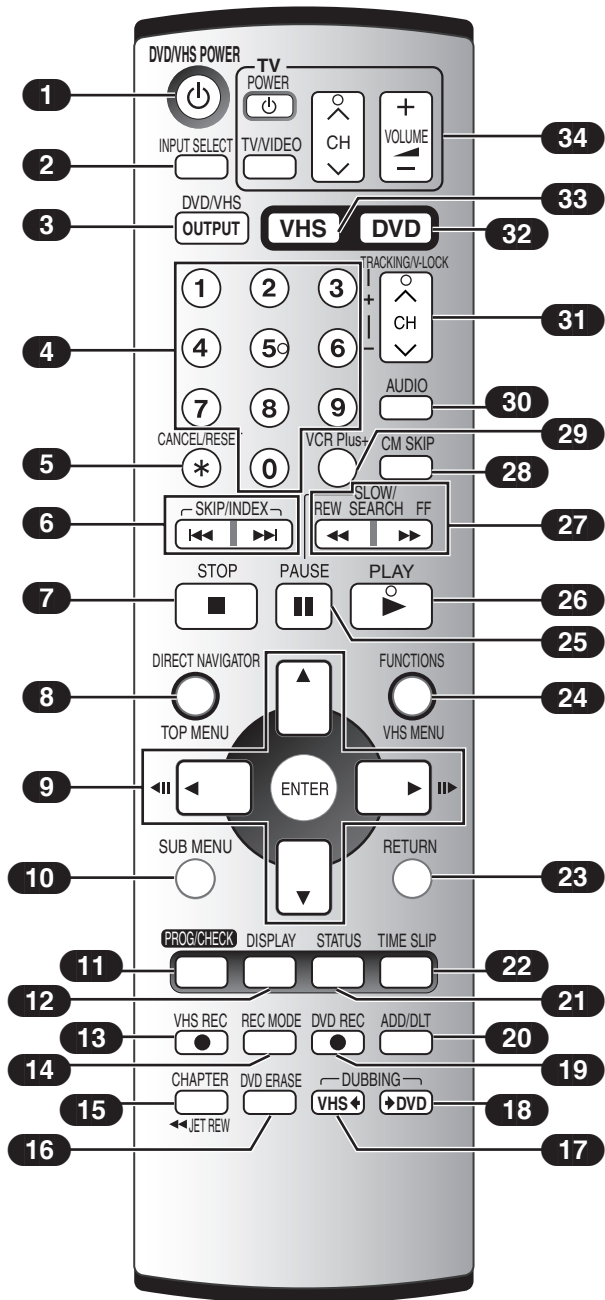

## Batteries

- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

### Do not:

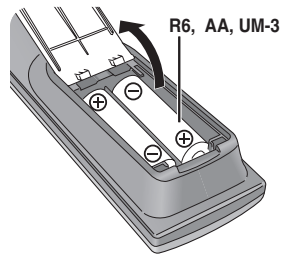
- mix old and new batteries.
- use different types at the same time.
- heat or expose to flame.
- take apart or short circuit.
- attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

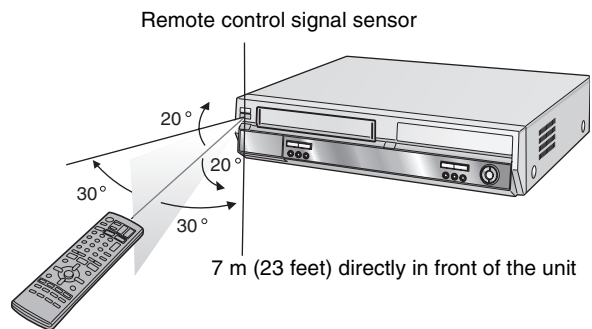

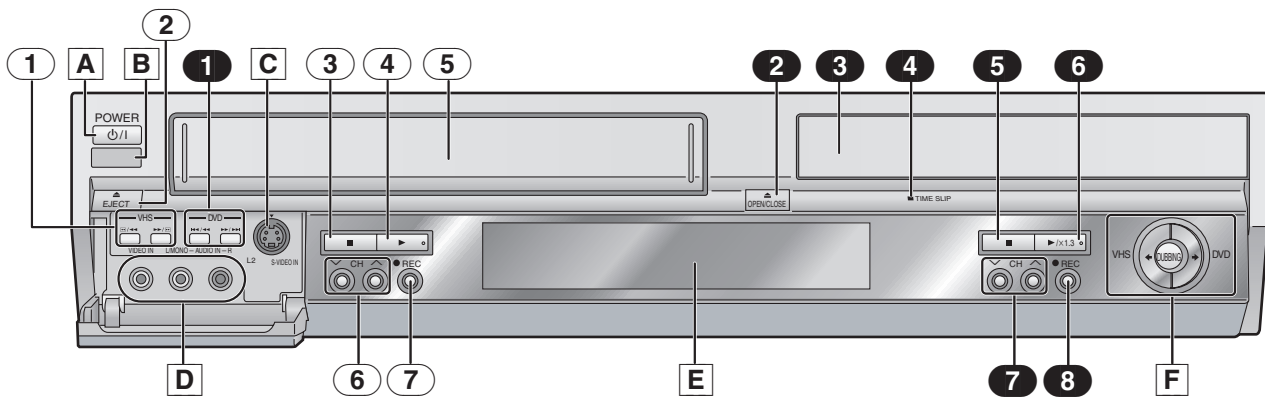
## Use

Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m (23 feet) directly in front of the unit.

- Keep the transmission window and the unit's sensor free from dust.
- Operation can be affected by strong light sources, such as direct sunlight, and the glass doors on cabinets.

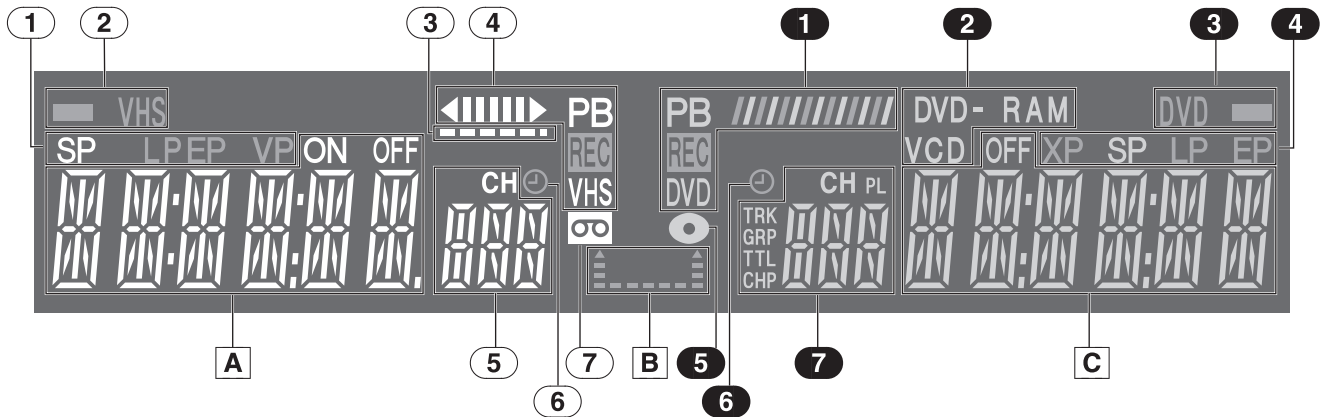
### Off Timer

The unit switches to standby when it is not being used about 6 hours.

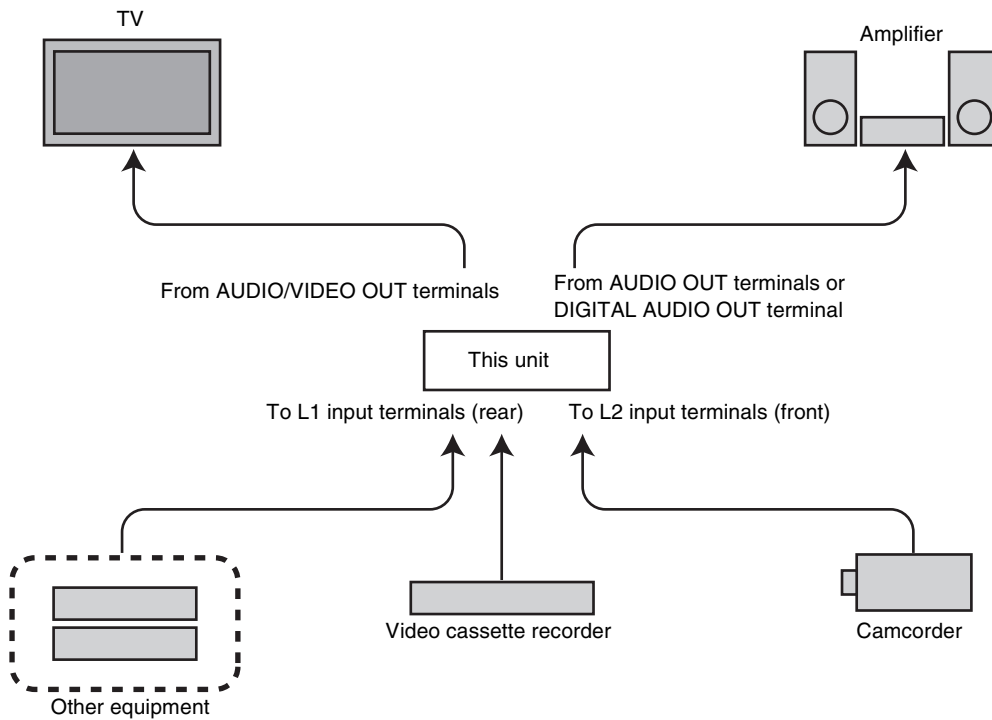

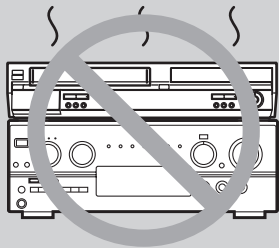

## STEP 1 Connection

### Examples of equipment you can connect to this unit's terminals



**Do not place the unit on amplifiers or equipment that may become hot.**  
The heat can damage the unit.



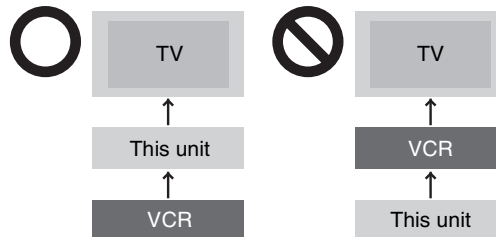
**Before moving the unit, ensure the disc tray is empty.**  
Failure to do so will risk severely damaging the disc and the unit.

### When the unit is not to be used for a long time

To save power, unplug it from the household AC outlet. This unit consumes a small amount of power even when it is turned off (approx. 2 W).

### Do not connect the unit through a video cassette recorder

Video signals fed through video cassette recorders will be affected by copyright protection systems and the picture will not be shown correctly on the TV.

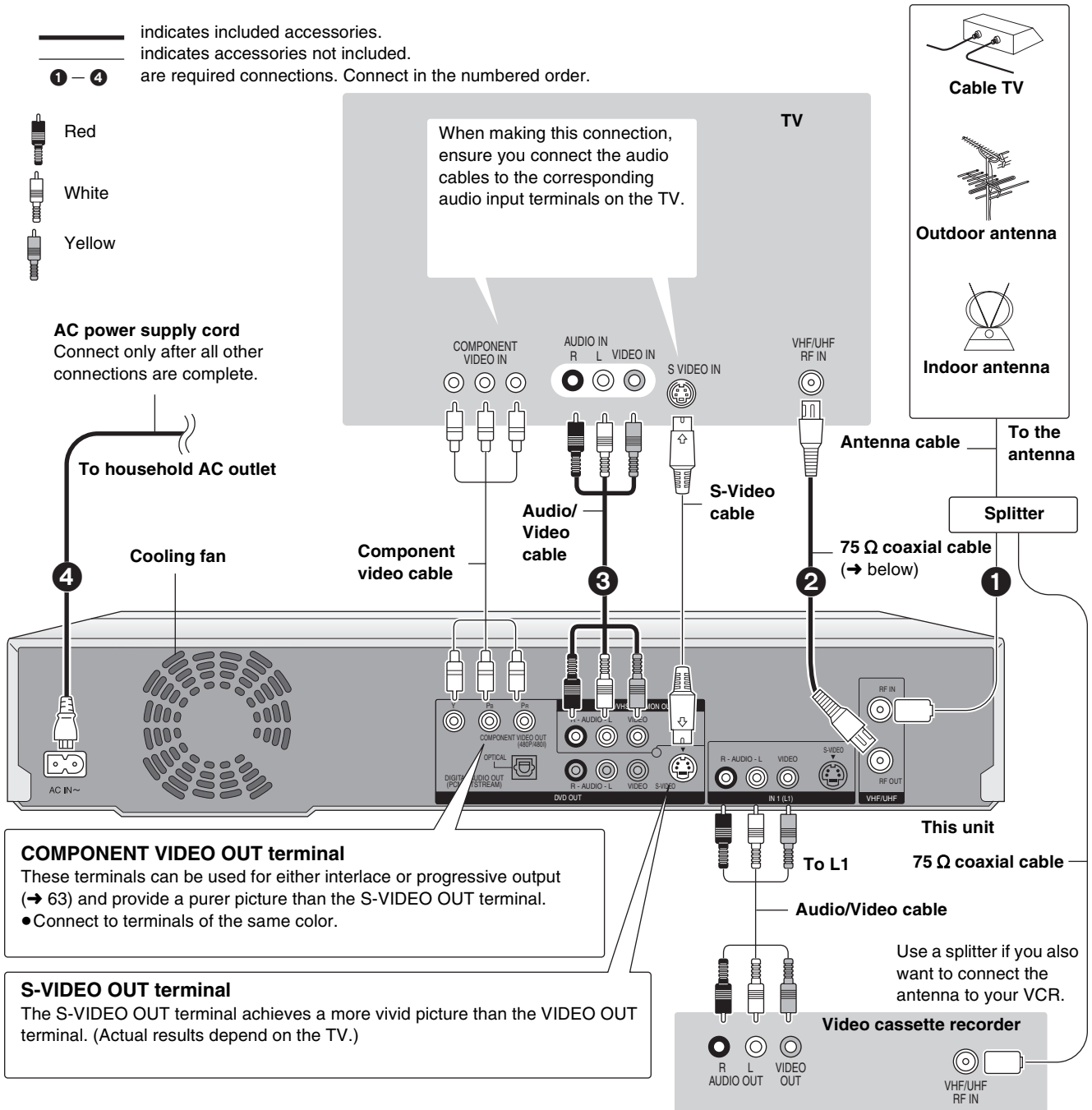


• When connecting to a TV with a built in VCR, connect to the input terminals on the TV side, not the VCR side.

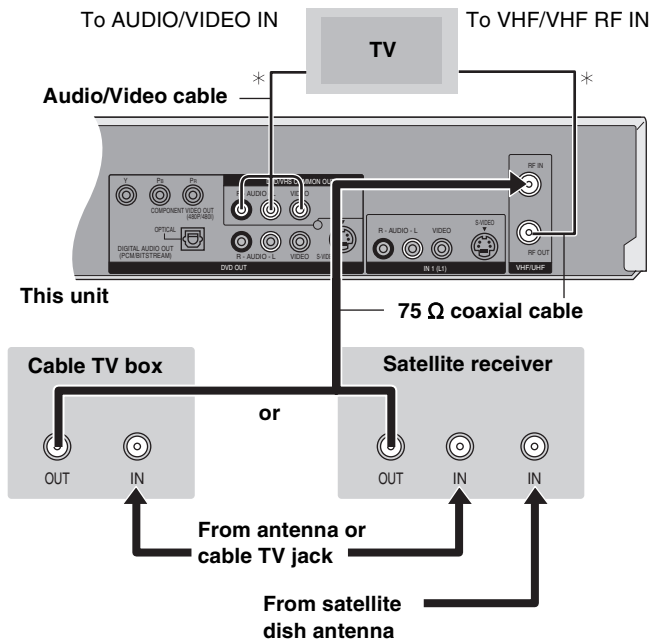
### ■ 75 Ω coaxial cable

- The picture and sound signal from this unit does not go through the 75 Ω coaxial cable to the TV. Make sure you connect one of the following terminals on this unit to the TV: the AUDIO/VIDEO OUT terminal, the S-VIDEO OUT terminal or the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT terminal. If the TV has none of these terminals, consult your local dealer.
- Refer to page 11 to if the antenna connector doesn't match.

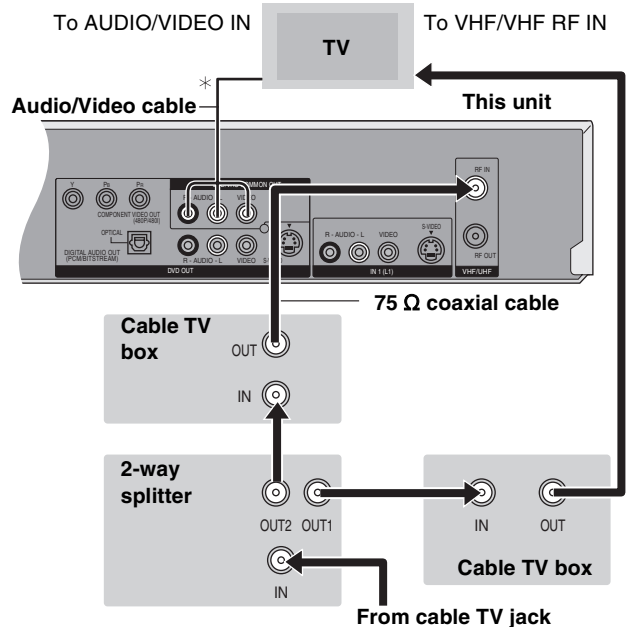

## ■ Connecting a cable TV box/satellite receiver

- You need to subscribe to a cable TV or satellite TV service to enjoy viewing their programming.
- Consult your service provider regarding appropriate cable TV box or satellite receiver.

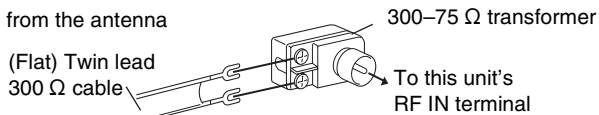

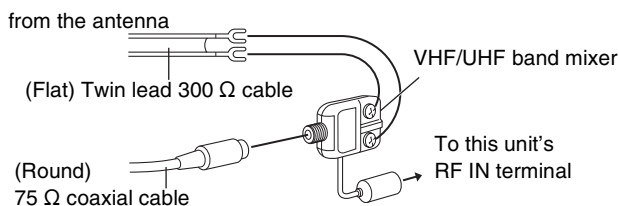

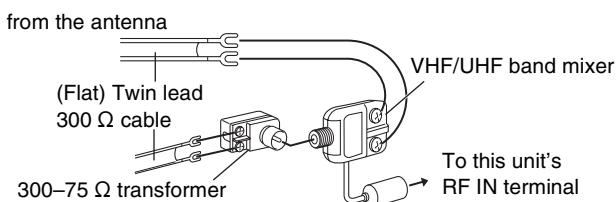
#### ■ A single twin lead

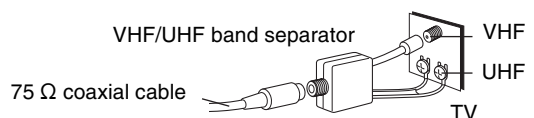

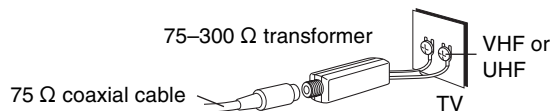

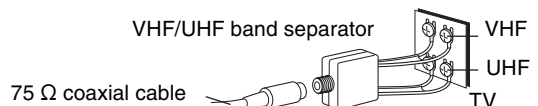
#### ■ A twin lead and coaxial plug terminal

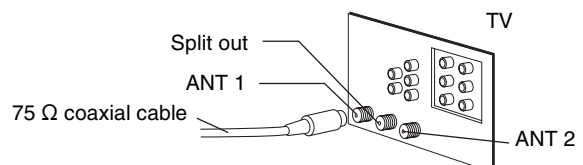

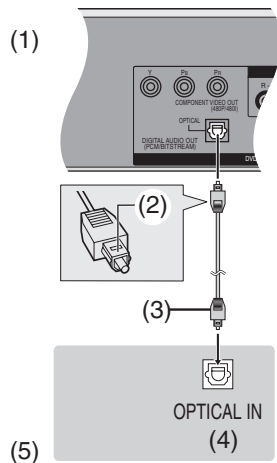
## Connecting amplifier or system component

### ■ To enjoy multi-channel surround sound on DVD-Video (digital connection)

Connect an amplifier with a built-in decoder with these logo marks.



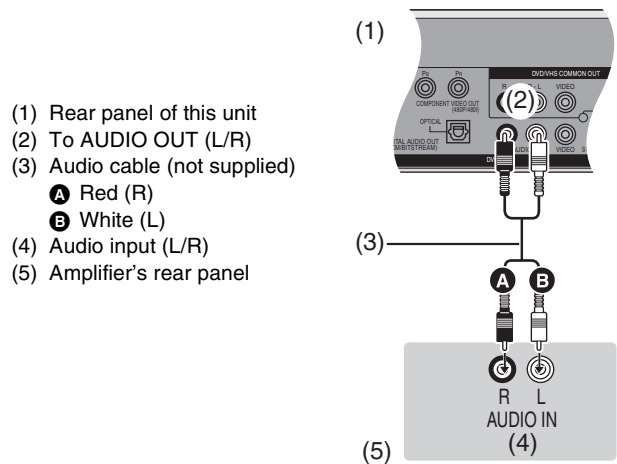
- Use an optical digital audio cable.
- Change the settings in "Digital Audio Output" (→ 44).
- You cannot use DTS Digital Surround decoders not suited to DVD.
- Even if using this connection, output will be only 2 channels when playing DVD-Audio



**DOLBY DIGITAL** **Dolby Digital (→ 44)**  
 This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Not only stereo (2 channel) audio, these signals can also be 5.1-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc by this method.

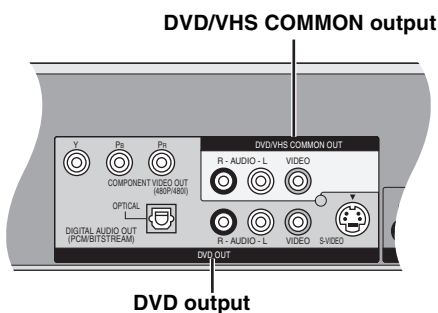
**DTS SURROUND** **DTS Digital Surround (→ 44)**  
 This surround system is used in many movie theatres around the world. The separation between channels is good and the compression ratio is low, so realistic sound effects are possible. DTS sound tracks are produced with the assumption that all channels will be used.

## DVD output and DVD/VHS output

This unit has DVD/VHS COMMON output terminals which are common to both DVD and VHS, and DVD output terminals which are exclusively used for DVD.



- For DVD/VHS COMMON output terminals, both DVD and VHS outputs can be switched.
- The DVD output terminals can only output the DVD signal.

• Even if "Automatic" is selected in "DVD/VHS Output" on "Set Up" Menu (→ 43), the desired output may not be selected depending on the operation. In this case, press [DVD/VHS OUTPUT] on the remote controller to switch manually.

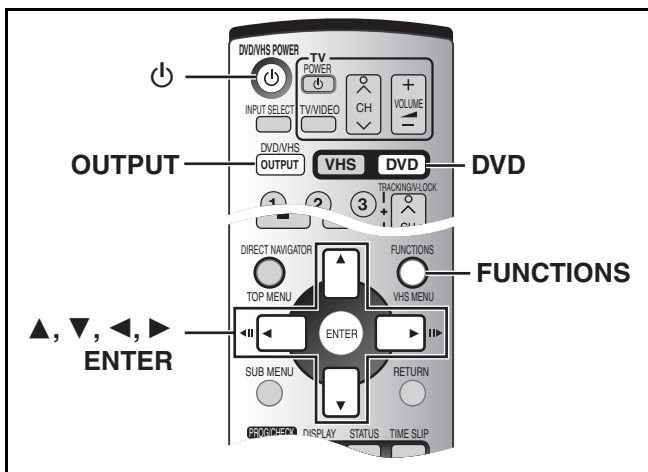
• When the Video is switched from DVD to VHS or vice versa, the audio volume may suddenly increase or decrease. This is because when the audio output of this unit is connected to the TV or other, the audio output of the DVD is generally lower. When you increase the volume level of the TV or the amplifier to play back DVD audio, reduce it when playback is finished.

### Preparation

- Press [DVD].
- 1 While stopped Press [FUNCTIONS]. (→ 47)
- 2 Select "SETUP" with [▲, ▼, ◀, ▶] and press [ENTER].
- 3 Select "Set Up" with [▲, ▼] and press [◀, ▶].
- 4 Select "DVD/VHS Output" with [▲, ▼] and press [ENTER].
- 5 Select "Automatic" or "Manual" with [▲, ▼] and press [ENTER].

## STEP 2 Plug-in Auto Tuning



After plugging the unit into your household AC outlet and pressing [⏻, DVD/VHS POWER] to turn the unit on for the first time, the unit assists you to set the on-screen language, and automatically tunes in all the channels it can receive and sets the clock.

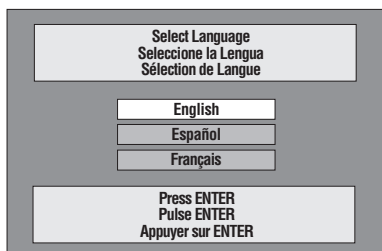
The unit automatically determines the type of transmission (airwaves or cable) and puts them into channels as follows.

### Preparation

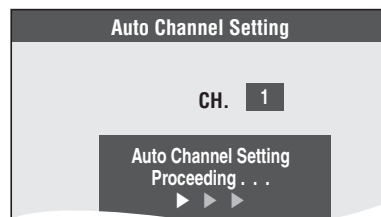
- Turn on the TV and select the appropriate video input to suit the connections to this unit.
- If you connect the unit through a cable TV box or satellite receiver (→ 11), tune to your local PBS for “Auto Clock Setting” to work. If there is no local PBS, set the clock manually (→ 46, “Manual Clock Setting”).
- Press [DVD].

### 1 Press [⏻, DVD/VHS POWER].

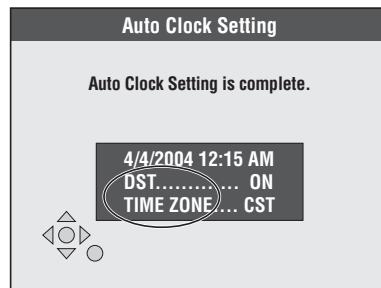


### 2 Use [▲, ▼] to select the language and press [ENTER].

### 3 Press [ENTER] to start Plug-in Auto Tuning.



The unit then proceeds with Auto Clock Setting. The time is displayed when finished.



- DST, Daylight Saving Time, shows the summertime setting.
- TIME ZONE shows the time difference from Greenwich mean time (GMT).

EST (Eastern Standard Time) = GMT –5  
 CST (Central Standard Time) = GMT –6  
 MST (Mountain Standard Time) = GMT –7  
 PST (Pacific Standard Time) = GMT –8  
 AST (Alaska Standard Time) = GMT –9

### 4 Press [ENTER].

#### ■ If the clock is an hour slower or faster than the actual time

- This unit is compatible with the Content Protection for Recordable Media (CPRM) system so you can record broadcasts that allow one copy, such as some CATV broadcasts, onto 4.7 GB/9.4 GB DVD-RAM (these are CPRM compatible). It is not possible to record onto DVD-R or 2.8 GB DVD-RAM.
- DVD-RAMs recorded on this unit cannot be played on incompatible players.
- We recommend using Panasonic's DVD-RAM, which has confirmed compatibility with this unit.
- The aspect ratio of the recorded images will be the same as that of the originals.

#### Protection of cartridge disc

You can protect the contents of your discs.

- With the write-protect tab in the protect position, you cannot record to, edit, or erase from the disc.



#### DVD-R

- You can play DVD-R on compatible DVD players by finalizing it on this unit.
- The aspect ratio of the recorded images will be 4:3.
- DVD-R can be recorded only in either of these audio types (Main or SAP). Select the desired audio type in "Select MTS" (→ 44).
- Some broadcasts carry signals that allow you to copy once, but you cannot record them with DVD-R. Use DVD-RAM to record these kinds of broadcast.
- Before finalizing, erasing titles will not increase the disc's available time.
- After finalizing, these DVD-R can no longer be recorded on or edited.

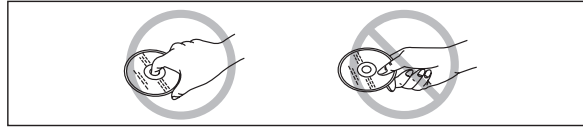

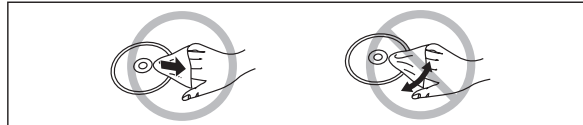

### Handling precautions

- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs. (This may cause disc warping and un-balanced rotation, rendering it unusable.)
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.
- Do not use the following discs:
  - Disc with exposed adhesive from removed stickers or labels (rented discs, etc.).
  - Discs that are badly warped or cracked.
  - Irregularly shaped discs, such as heart shapes.



- Do not place in the following areas:
  - In direct sunlight.
  - In very dusty or humid areas.
  - Near a heater.

- Discs must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- Compatible compression rate: from 32 kbps to 320 kbps
- Compatible sampling rate: 16 kHz, 22.05 kHz, 24 kHz, 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz
- Maximum number of tracks and groups recognizable: 999 tracks and 99 groups
- This unit is compatible with multi-session.
- This unit is not compatible with ID3 tags or packet writing.
- Depending on recording, some items may not be playable.
- Reading or play of the disc may take time if there are a lot of still pictures or sessions.
- The display order may differ from how the order is displayed on a computer.

### ■ Naming folders and files

At the time of recording, give folder and file names a 3-digit numeric prefix in the order you want them to play (this may not work at times).



- MP3 files must have the extension “.MP3” or “.mp3”.
- English alphabet and Arabic numerals are displayed properly. Other characters may not be displayed properly.

- Sound is not output while fast-forwarding.

- When recording more than one program in a row, for DVD-RAM the first few seconds, and for DVD-R about the first 30 seconds of all programs from the second one onwards will not be recorded.
- If you set “DST” (Daylight Saving Time) to “ON” when manually setting the clock (→ 46), timer recording may not work when summer switches to winter and vice versa.
- When the unit is carrying out a timer recording:
  - You may utilize playback.
- When the disc is not inserted, the disc is full or a non-recordable disc is inserted, the warning message appears because Timer Recording is disabled.

## Inserting video cassette


The surface from which you can see a roll of tape should face up,  
**Insert a video cassette.**

- This unit is automatically turned on.


### ■ To eject a video cassette

- You can eject a video cassette when the unit is in standby mode. It switches back to standby once it ejects the video cassette.

### For main unit.

- Press [, EJECT] on the main unit.

### For remote control.

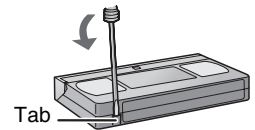
- Press [VHS] and then press and hold [, STOP] for about 3 or more seconds.



## Video cassette information

### ■ Video cassettes

- Break out the video cassette's tab to prevent accidental erasure. Cover the hole with a double layer of adhesive tape when you want to use the video cassette for recording again.
- You can use video cassettes with the VHS and S-VHS marks, but this unit is unable to make full use of the characteristics of S-VHS video cassettes.



### ■ Video cassette care

- Poor quality or damaged video cassettes can cause the heads to become dirty and malfunction. Store your video cassettes carefully and discard them when they become dirty or damaged.
- Never use video cassettes on which juice has been spilt or those that are extremely damaged since this will not only cause the heads to become dirty, but will also make the unit malfunction.

### ■ Maintenance

#### Cleaning the video heads

Dirt on the video heads can cause poor recording and play.



If the picture does not improve, use an optional head-cleaning cassette (part number NV-TCL30PT). If the problem persists, seek advice from a qualified service person.

#### Cautions before you operate this unit

Avoid:

- Magnets or electromagnetic objects.
- Putting anything heavy on the unit.

Do:

- Install the unit in a horizontal position.

#### Condensation may form in the following cases:

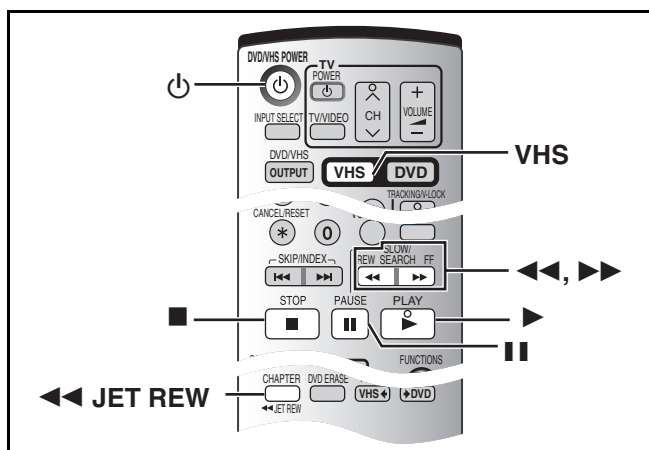
- The unit is brought from cold surroundings into a well-heated room.
- The unit is suddenly brought from cool surroundings, such as an air-conditioned room or car, to a place which is hot and humid.

**Note:**

- In any of the above-mentioned conditions, do not operate the unit for at least 1 hour. This unit is not equipped with a dew sensor.



## Playing a video cassette



### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.
- Press [VHS].

**1 Press [⏻, DVD/VHS POWER] to turn the unit on.**

**2 Insert a recorded video cassette. (→ 48)**

**3 Press [▶, PLAY].**

- Play starts automatically if you insert a video cassette that has had its tab removed.

### Preparation

- Press [VHS].

## Fast-forward / Rewind

### While stopped

Press [◀◀] (backward)/[▶▶] (forward).

## Cue / Review

### During play

Tap or keep pressing [◀◀] (backward)/[▶▶] (forward).

- If you keep pressing these buttons, playback restarts by releasing them.
- Press [▶, PLAY] to restart playback.

## Jet Search

### During play

Tap [◀◀] (backward)/[▶▶] (forward) twice. You can increase Cue/Review search speed.

- Press [▶, PLAY] to restart playback.
- Select search speed to view the recorded picture. (→ 56)
- The picture that appears in EP or VP mode at approx. 35 times speed may be distorted. A vertical scroll may occur. It is not a malfunction but if it happens, change to approx. 27 times speed.
- The picture may not be in colour or may be distorted depending on the TV.

### ■ To still playback

Press [⏸, PAUSE]. (Press again to restart play.)

### ■ To stop play

Press [■, STOP].

### Note:

- When the unit is off, an inserted video cassette can be played back by pressing [▶, PLAY].
- When the tape reaches its end, this unit automatically rewinds it to the beginning. This function does not work during timer recording, fast-forwarding and specified stop recording.
- Jet Search, cue, review or slow playback will be automatically released after 10 minutes, and still playback, after 5 minutes.
- When viewing a still picture or slow playback, the picture that appears in VP mode may be distorted.
- When playing back a tape which was recorded on another VCR, it may be necessary to adjust tracking (→ 50). In some cases the picture quality may still be inferior. This is due to format constraints.

## Slow

### During play

Press and hold [⏸, PAUSE] for 2 seconds or more.

- Press [▶, PLAY] to restart playback.

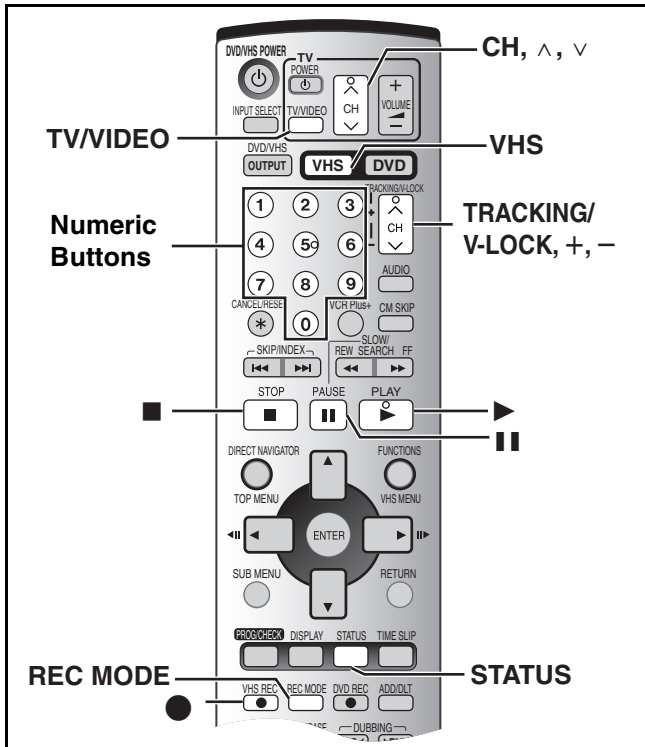
## Jet Rewind

### To perform a Higher Speed Rewind

Press [JET REW ◀◀].

The "J. REW" indication appears on the TV screen (except when the remaining tape time indication appears).

- Depending on the tape or an operating condition, the rewind speed may change somewhat.
- The tape counter is reset to "0:00.00" when the tape is rewound to the beginning.
- Depending on the tape, this function may not work.



### Preparation

- Press [VHS].

## S-VHS Quasi Playback (SQPB)

- It is also possible to play back tapes recorded in the S-VHS system.
- Some picture noise may occur depending on the type of tape used.
  - It is not possible to fully obtain the high resolution that S-VHS is capable of.
- It is not possible to record in the S-VHS system with this unit.

## Repeat Playback

During play or while stopped

Keep pressing [▶, PLAY] for 5 or more seconds.

- The "RP" indication appears on the display.
- At the end of the program, the tape rewinds to the beginning of the program and plays it again (it only works if there is at least 5 seconds blank at the end of the program). This repeats until you cancel it.

### To cancel

Press [■, STOP].



## Adjusting the playback picture

### Manual tracking

The unit usually makes tracking adjustments, but you may need to do it manually if noise appears on a tape recorded on other equipment.

During play

Press [TRACKING/V-LOCK, +] or [TRACKING/V-LOCK, -].

Repeat until the noise disappears.

### Vertical locking adjustment

Adjust the vertical to stop the picture from jiggling while paused.

While paused

Press [TRACKING/V-LOCK, +] or [TRACKING/V-LOCK, -].

Repeat until the jiggling stops.

### To return to auto tracking

Press both [TRACKING/V-LOCK, +] and [TRACKING/V-LOCK, -] simultaneously.

### To remove the noise from a paused picture

Start slow play, then adjust the tracking.

Note:

- This may not work with some TV models and tapes.
- You can also adjust the tracking and vertical with [CH, ^, v] on the unit.

## Recording TV programs

### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.
- Check that the clock is set to the correct time. If it has not been set, refer to page 46.
- Press [VHS].

### 1 Insert a video cassette with an intact erasure prevention tab. (→ 48)

### 2 Press [CH, ▲, ▼] to select the TV station.

- If you keep pressing these buttons, the channels change quickly.
- You can also select channels with the numeric buttons.

#### TV Mode (Airwaves)

e.g., "5": [0]→[5]  
 "15": [1]→[5]

#### CATV Mode (Cable)

e.g., "5": [0]→[0]→[5]  
 "15": [0]→[1]→[5]  
 "115": [1]→[1]→[5]

### 3 Press [REC MODE] to select the tape speed.

Each time you press the button:  
 SP→EP→VP→SP

### 4 Press [●, VHS REC] to start recording.

### ■ To pause Recording

Press [||, PAUSE]. (Press it again to restart recording.)

### ■ To stop recording

Press [■, STOP].

### Tape speed

SP: You can record the length shown on the tape.

EP: Three times the length of SP mode.

VP: Five times the length of SP mode.

- To have a longer recording capacity, select "EP" or "VP".
- If the image quality is important to you or if you wish to store the tape for a long period, select "SP".
- This unit can play tapes recorded with LP mode on other equipment ("LP" lights on the display).

#### VP mode:

- "VP" flashes on the unit's display for 8 seconds after recording has started.
- **A tape recorded in VP mode by this unit cannot be played back by other VCRs. It is recommended to distinguish it from other tapes by indicating "VP" on the tape label, etc.**
- It takes more time for automatic tracking to work when playing tapes recorded with VP mode, and it may not work at all with some tapes. Do tracking manually if this is the case (→ 50).

### Note:

- **Even if the video cassette you use is labeled "S-VHS", it is not possible to record in the S-VHS system with this unit. It records in normal VHS system.**
- **You cannot play VP recording on other equipment.**
- You cannot change channels while recording. You can change channels while in pause mode.
- When recording is paused for more than 5 minutes, the unit returns to stop mode.

### ■ To Display the Approximate Remaining Tape Time

1 Select "TAPE SELECT" from the on screen display and select the corresponding tape length. (→ 56)

2 Press [STATUS].

The display changes as follows each time [STATUS] is pressed.

Clock → Counter → **Remaining Tape Time** → Clock

- The remaining tape time may not be displayed correctly depending on the tape used.

### ■ To specify a time to stop recording

#### While recording

Press [●, VHS REC] to select the recording time.

- On the main unit, press [●, REC].

#### Unit's Display

Each time you press the button:

Counter (cancel) → 0:30 → 1:00 → 1:30

↑ 4:00 ← 3:00 ← 2:00 ←

#### For your reference

- This does not work during timer recording.
- Recording stops and the set time is cleared if you press [■, STOP].
- The set time is cleared if you change the recording mode or channel while recording is paused.

## Watching the TV while recording

### 1 Press [TV/VIDEO] to change the input mode to "TV".

### 2 Press TV's [CH, ▲, ▼] to select the desired TV channel.

#### For your reference

- You can also do this if the unit is making a timer recording.
- The recording is unaffected.

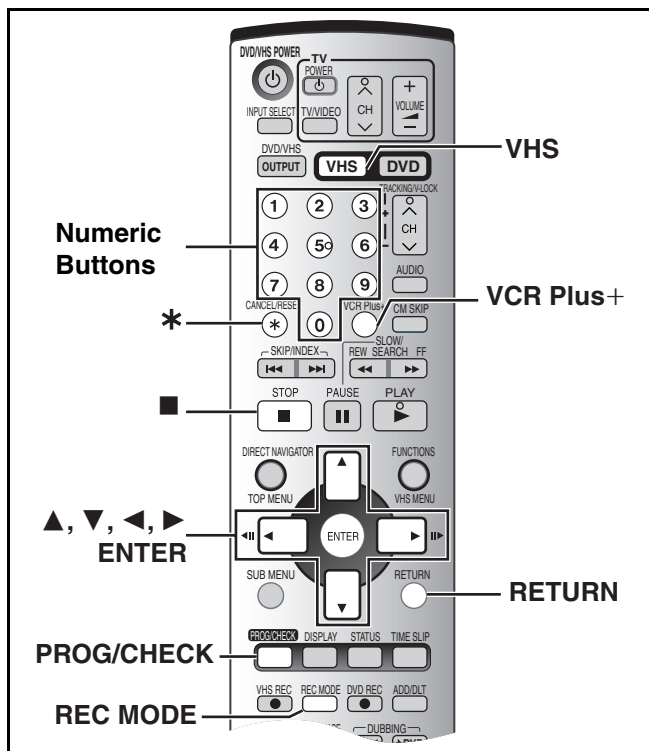
## Playing/Recording DVD while recording

You can watch play or record discs while recording. The recording will not be affected.

- DVD playback (→ 21)

- DVD recording (→ 26)

- When a tuner channel is being recorded on VHS, you can only record the same channel on DVD.



### Caution for Timer recording

Timer recording automatically starts at the set time.  
 • Timer recording can be started whether the unit is turned on or off. When the unit is turned off, the sound and the video cannot be outputted to the TV.

You can enter up to 16 programs up to a month in advance.

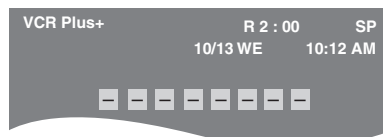

## Using VCR Plus+ system

Entering the PlusCode numbers is an easy way of timer recording. You can find these codes in TV listings in newspapers and magazines.

- When connecting a cable TV box or satellite receiver, the VCR Plus+ system does not work. Program the timer recording manually (→ right).

### 1 Press [VCR Plus+].



### 2 Press the numeric buttons to enter the PlusCode number.

- Press [◀] to move back to correct a digit.

### 3 Press [ENTER].

Confirm the program and correct it if necessary using [▲, ▼, ▶, ←]. (→ right, step 3).



- "INVALID ENTRY" is displayed when you enter the wrong PlusCode number. Reenter the PlusCode number.

### 4 If the program is correct Press [ENTER].

- "☺" lights on the unit's display.

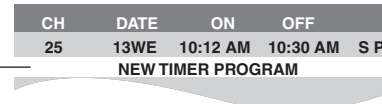

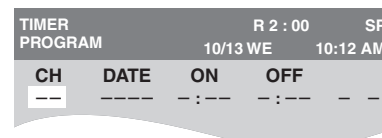

#### Note

- "☺" and "☹" flashes when the unit cannot perform timer recording (e.g., video cassette with no prevention tab or no video cassette in the cassette compartment).
- The actual time recorded may be longer than the program itself when TV programs are recorded using VCR Plus+ system.
- If you set "DST" (Daylight Saving Time) to "ON" when manually setting the clock (→ 46), timer recording may not work when summer switches to winter and vice versa.

### To stop recording while a program is working

Press [■, STOP], then [ENTER] within 5 seconds.

- You can also press and hold [■] on the main unit for more than 3 seconds to stop recording.

## Auto SP/EP mode

If, at the beginning of a timer program, there is not enough tape remaining to complete the recording, the SP/EP function will automatically run the tape at EP speed. This ensures that the entire program will be recorded. If EP mode is not enough to stretch the remaining tape to fit the whole program you will not be able to record all of the TV program.

- It is not possible to automatically activate VP mode.
- The tape length must be set correctly. (→ 56)
- Some tapes may not work correctly.
- If the tape speed changes from SP to EP during a timer recording, some brief picture distortion occurs at that point.

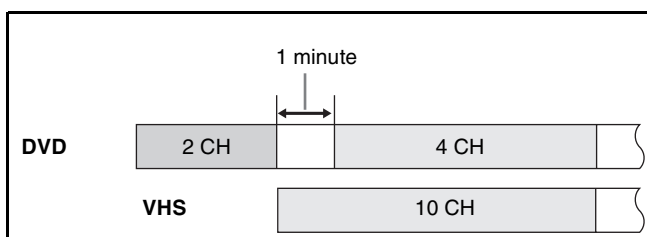
## Cautions for using timer recording on DVD and VHS

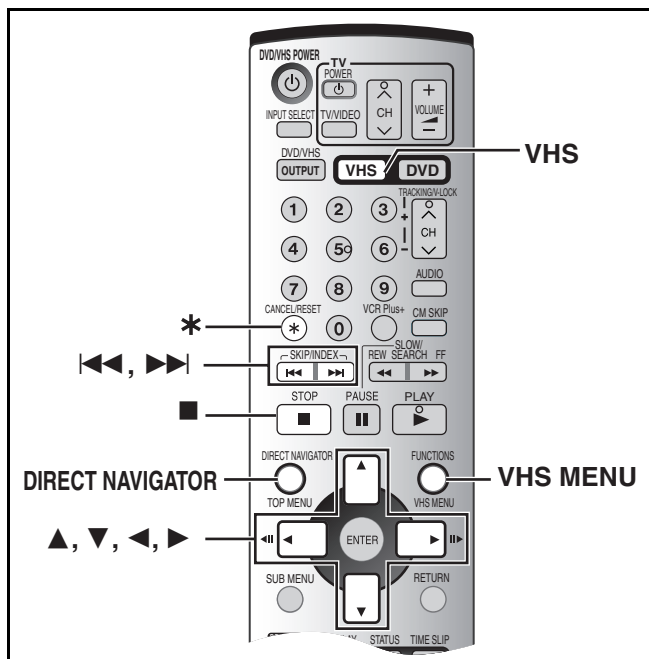
Timer recording for TV programs cannot be executed on both DVD and VHS at the same time.

Make sure the timer recording start times do not overlap on both DVD (→ 29) and VHS (→ left) timer-programming screens.

When the timer recording settings overlap:

- When the start time of both timer recordings is the same, the timer recording of DVD has priority.
- When tuner channels are specified in timer recordings on both VHS and DVD, only one timer recording can be started.
- When the interval between the first timer recording and the second timer recording on DVD is 1 minute or less as shown below, the second timer recording on DVD has priority over the timer recording on VHS even if its start time is later than the timer recording on VHS.





### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.
- Press [VHS].

## Direct Navigator

This unit can display a list of the recorded programs on the inserted tape on the TV screen. You can then select the desired program, and this unit will quickly reach its beginning and start playback.

### ■ To save Direct Navigator data

#### Preparation

- The tape length of the inserted tape must be set correctly. (→ 56)
- The unit must not be in timer recording.
- A program of at least 15 minutes must be recorded on the tape.

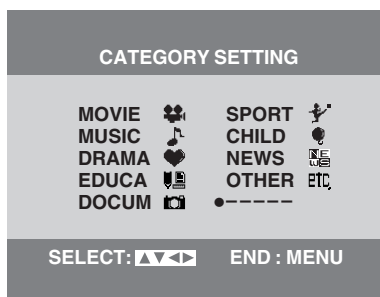

- The Direct Navigator list is stored on each tape. Up to 20 tapes and 50 programs can be registered.
- The Direct Navigator program list displays up to 14 programs. If you have already stored 14 programs on a tape and then store another one, the oldest item is replaced.
- Signals approximately 10 seconds before and after the current tape position are checked. During checking, "CHECKING DIRECT NAVIGATOR DATA." is displayed on the TV screen.
- Checking cannot be performed properly where there are no signals, such as unrecorded portions of the tape. In this case, press [DIRECT NAVIGATOR] at a portion of the tape where a program has been recorded on this unit. When a signal still cannot be found, the message "CAN NOT FIND DIRECT NAVIGATOR DATA." appears on the TV.
- "REMAINING PROGRAM 0 DELETE DIRECT NAVIGATOR DATA." appears when you try to store more than 50 programs. The new item is added and the oldest item is deleted.
- "REMAINING CASSETTE 0 FOR DIRECT NAVIGATOR DELETE DIRECT NAVIGATOR DATA." appears when you try to store items for more than 20 tapes. Programs recorded without deleting data as instructed are not registered in the list.
- The list does not appear when playing tapes recorded on other equipment.
- When recording over the same location on a tape, it may not work correctly.

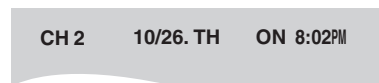
## To Check the Recorded Programming Data (Time Stamp Function)

When playback starts after searching with the Direct Navigator function or the index search function, recorded programming data (called Time Stamp) appears on the TV screen for approx. 5 seconds.

## VHS Index Search System (VISS)

This unit automatically records special index signals on the tape every time a recording is started. The index search function makes use of these index signals to let you find the beginning of a desired program quickly and easily.

- When a recording is started by pressing [●, VHS REC].
- When timer recording is activated.

### Preparation

- Display the unit's picture on the TV.

- Insert a recorded video cassette.

### While stopped or during normal play

- Each press increases the number of skips.

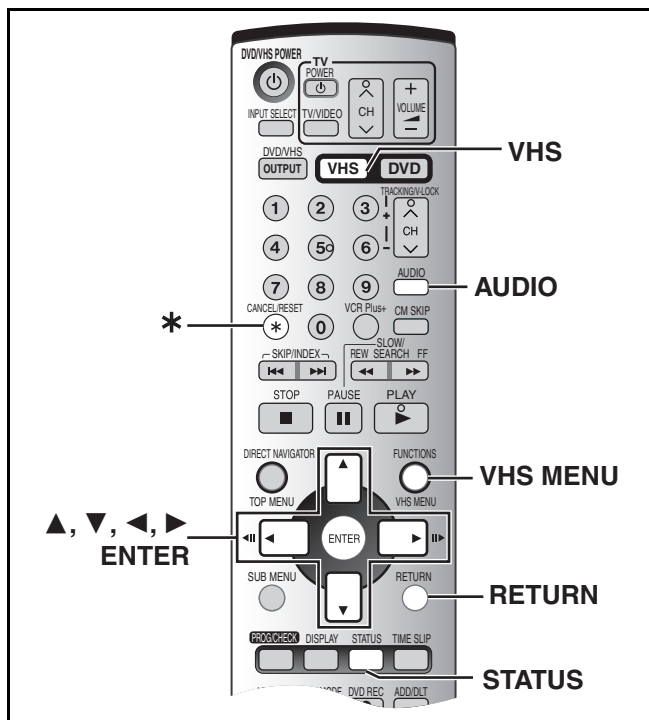

## Auto Bilingual Choice Function

When a stereo broadcast or SAP broadcast is recorded and played back on this unit, stereo sound will be automatically selected in the case of a stereo broadcast and SAP sound will be automatically selected in the case of a dual-sound broadcast (Mono and SAP or Stereo and SAP).

- The wrong choice may be made if the program is played back from an interim point. (In a case like this, press [AUDIO] and select the right sound only in playback.)
- The function will not work with a cassette which has been recorded using external equipment.

## Transfer (Dubbing) from VHS



### ■ One Touch Transfer (Dubbing) (VHS → DVD)

#### RAM DVD-R

You can transfer (dubbing) programs recorded on a tape onto a disc\* with one stroke of the button.

In One-Touch Dubbing, programs are automatically dubbed onto the disc from the location of playback on the tape.

\* Available discs for transfer (dubbing) from tape are DVD-RAM and non-finalized DVD-R.

#### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.

#### DVD

- Release protection (disc → 30, cartridge → 18). **RAM**
- Insert a disc and confirm there is sufficient empty space for recording on it. (→ 20, 47)
- Select the recording mode.
- When SAP broadcast program is played back on VHS, the audio on DVD is recorded according to the settings in "Select MTS" in the initial settings. (→ 44) **DVD-R**

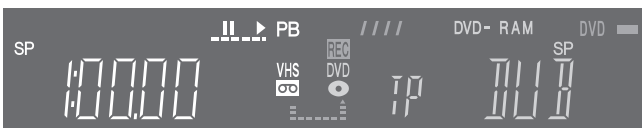
#### VHS

- Insert the video cassette containing the program to be copied (→ 48).

- 1 While both DVD/VHS are stopped, Press and hold [DVD, DUBBING] for 3 seconds or more.

On the main unit, press [DVD].

- Check if transfer (dubbing) starts properly.

- Dubbing is automatically completed when the tape reaches its end or the disc becomes full.



#### ■ To stop transfer (dubbing) halfway through

- When a Copy-guarded tape is inserted, a message appears on the display and the recording stops on the spot.
- If a part of the tape recorded in VP mode is dubbed to disc, noises may appear at the beginning of the dubbed part.

#### ■ Dividing a title to be dubbed

In One-Touch Transfer (Dubbing) from VHS to DVD, the title is divided by index signal detected and then recorded. You can search desired titles with Direct Navigator's Title View (→ 33) after transfer (dubbing) to DVD.

- Titles recorded within 15 minutes (25 minutes in VP mode) of each other may not be divided properly.
- The recording time may become longer than the original title depending on the number of index signals.

## ■ Manual Transfer (Dubbing)

### RAM DVD-R

You can specify the position to start transfer (dubbing) of the program recorded on the tape to the disc.

- Available discs for transfer (dubbing) from tape are DVD-RAM and non-finalized DVD-R.
- Copy-guarded video tapes cannot be dubbed. Most video tapes are copy-guarded to prevent illegal reproduction and they cannot be recorded with the following procedure.

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.

### DVD

- Release protection (disc → 30, cartridge → 18). **RAM**
- Insert a disc and confirm there is sufficient empty space for recording on it. (→ 20, 47)

### VHS

- Insert the video cassette containing the program to be copied (→ 48).
- Check the channel. If “DC” channel is selected, transfer (dubbing) does not work properly.
  - When the “DC” channel is selected on VHS, you cannot select the “TP” channel.

### 1 Press [VHS] and press [▶, PLAY].

Start playing the video cassette and find the recording start point.

- Select the audio to be played (the audio to be recorded) beforehand.

### 2 Press [II, PAUSE] at the start point of the recording.

### 3 Press [DVD].

- The VHS picture is displayed on the TV.

### 5 Press [REC MODE] to select the recording mode.

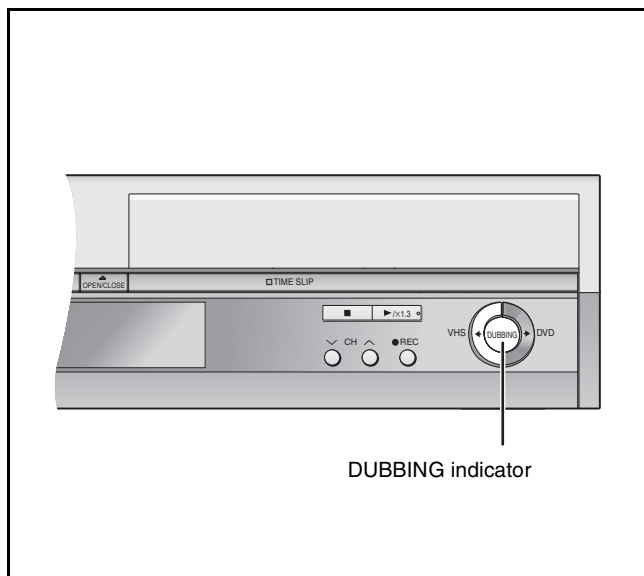
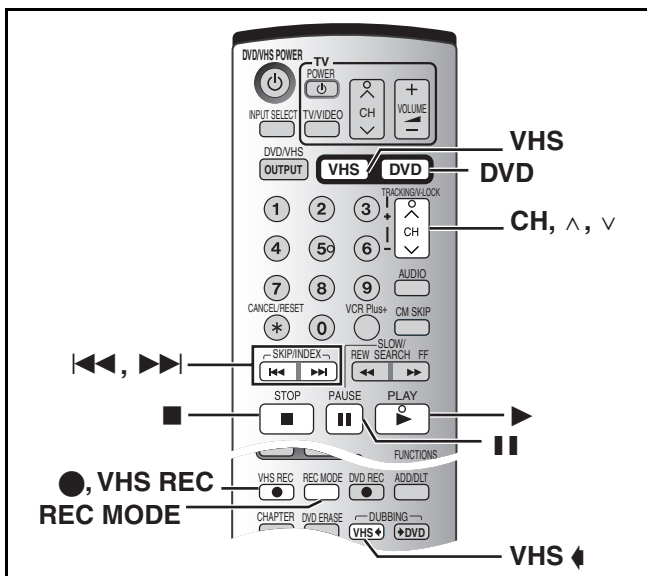

(TP: Dubbing input channel)

### ■ One Touch Transfer (Dubbing) (DVD → VHS)

You can transfer (dubbing) programs recorded on a disc\* onto a tape with one stroke of the button.

In One-Touch Dubbing, all contents on the disc are automatically dubbed onto the tapes.

\* Available discs for transfer (dubbing) onto tape are DVD-RAM and non-finalized DVD-R. Most DVD videos cannot be dubbed because they are copy-guarded.

#### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.

#### DVD

- Insert the disc containing the program to be copied (→ 20).

#### VHS

- Insert a video cassette with an intact erasure prevention tab. (→ 48)
- Confirm that the remaining tape time is sufficient for recording. (→ 57)
- Select the recording mode.

- 1 While both DVD/VHS are stopped, Press and hold [VHS ↵, DUBBING] for 3 seconds or more.

On the main unit, press [VHS ↵].

- Check if transfer (dubbing) starts properly.
- The [DUBBING] indicator on the main unit lights.
- Dubbing is automatically completed when playback of the disc is finished or the tape reaches its end.



### ■ To stop transfer (dubbing) halfway through

Press [■, STOP].

- When transfer (dubbing) is completed, a message indicating the end of transfer (dubbing) appears on the TV screen and then disappears a few seconds later.

### ■ When transfer (dubbing) is started, the following operations also start automatically:

- "Status Messages" on Display → "Off" (→ 45)
- Recording channel indication on VHS → "DC"
- Output to TV → VHS output
- Audio output when playing back DVD → Stereo (L R) **RAM**

### ■ Only the following operations are allowed while transfer (dubbing):

- Stopping transfer (dubbing) by pressing [■, STOP].

#### Note:

- While One Touch Transfer (Dubbing) is activated, timer recording cannot be started.
- When "DVD/VHS Output" is set to "Manual" (→ 43), or when DVD output is selected in starting transfer (dubbing), the output is switched to VHS automatically at the time when transfer (dubbing) is started.
  - When the transfer (dubbing) is already started, you cannot switch the output manually.
- When the transfer (dubbing) is not started or not executed, the "DUBBING" indicator blinks for about 7 seconds. Check if the unit is properly prepared.
- If you start transfer (dubbing) when "PB" is blinking on the unit's display, the DVD is dubbed from the beginning of the title which you stopped.

### ■ About Recording VISS (→ 55)

In One-Touch Dubbing from DVD to VHS, the index signal is automatically recorded for each title. You can search desired titles with [◀◀] or [▶▶].

## ■ Manual Transfer (Dubbing)

You can specify the position to start transfer (dubbing) of the program recorded on the disc to the tape.

- Copy-guarded discs cannot be dubbed. Most discs are copy-guarded to prevent illegal reproduction and they cannot be recorded with the following procedure.

### Preparation

- Select the unit viewing channel (or the AV input) on the TV.

### DVD

- Insert the disc containing the program to be copied (→ 20).
- Check the channel. If “TP” channel is selected, transfer (dubbing) does not work properly.
  - When the “TP” channel is selected on DVD, you cannot select the “DC” channel.

### VHS

- Insert a video cassette with an intact erasure prevention tab. (→ 48)
- Confirm that the remaining tape time is sufficient for recording. (→ 57)

Start playing the disc and find the recording start point.

- Select the audio to be played (the audio to be recorded) beforehand. **RAM**
- When the DVD-R is inserted, you cannot select the audio.

(DC: Dubbing input channel)

- DC channel can be recorded only when the VHS input channel is set to “DC”.
- When you play back a tape with the channel set to “DC”, the DVD picture is displayed on the TV screen.

## Recording from an external device

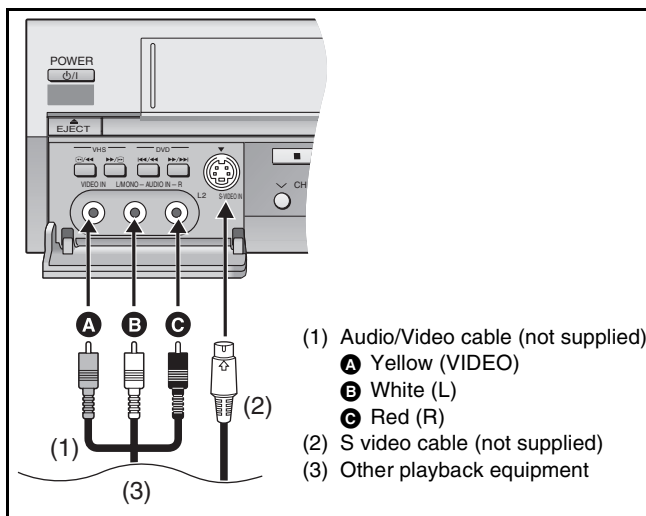
When connecting to the L2 input terminals on the front of the unit

- You can also connect to the L1 input terminals on the rear of the unit.

Before connecting any cables, first make sure that the power for both units is off. Then, after connecting cables, turn on both units.

### Note

- When recording using this unit's input terminals, only the sound received at the time of recording will be recorded. As long as secondary audio that is recorded on the media in the external device is not output to the unit in play, it is not recorded.
- If the audio output of the other equipment is monaural, connect to L/MONO. (Both left and right channels are recorded when connected through L/MONO.)
- The S-VIDEO terminal achieves a more vivid picture than the VIDEO terminal.



### Preparation

#### DVD RAM DVD-R

- Release protection (disc → 30, cartridge → 18). **RAM**
- Press [DVD].

#### VHS

- Insert a video cassette with an intact erasure prevention tab. (→ 48)
- Press [VHS].

**1 Press [REC MODE] to select the recording mode.**  
 (DVD → 27, VHS → 51)

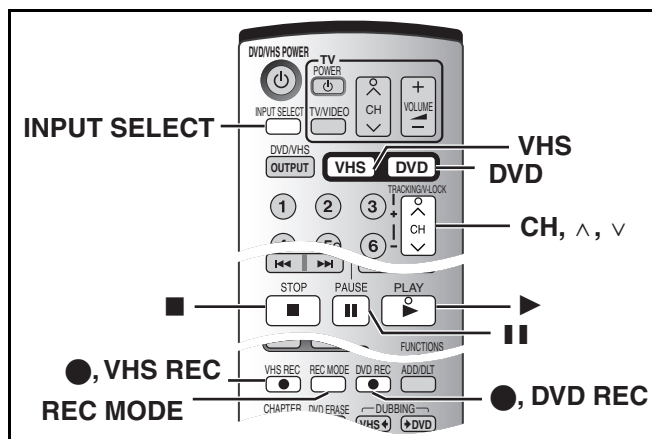
#### DVD RAM DVD-R

- It is also possible to perform Flexible Recording (FR). (→ 27)

### ■ To skip unwanted parts

### For your reference

- Almost all videos and DVD software on sale have been treated to prevent illegal copying. Such software cannot be recorded.

## Glossary

### Bitstream

This is the digital form of multi-channel audio data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

### CPRM (Content Protection for Recordable Media)

CPRM is technology used to protect broadcasts that are allowed to be recorded only once. Such broadcasts can be recorded only with CPRM compatible recorders and discs.

### Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs. Dynamic range compression means reducing the gap between the loudest and softest sounds. This means you can listen at low volumes but still hear dialog clearly.

### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. This unit can determine which type has been used, then uses the most suitable method of progressive output.

- Film is 24 or 30 frames per second, with motion picture film generally being 24 frames per second.
- Video is 60 fields per second (two fields making up one frame).

### Finalize

A process that makes play of a recorded CD-R, CD-RW, DVD-R etc. possible on equipment that can play such media. You can finalize DVD-R on this unit.

### Formatting

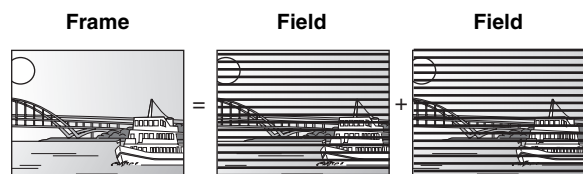
Formatting is the process of making media such as DVD-RAM recordable on recording equipment.

You can format DVD-RAM on this unit.

Formatting irrevocably erases all recordings on the disc.

### Frame and field

Frame refers to the single images that constitute the video you see on your TV. Each frame consists of two fields.



- A frame still shows two fields, so there may be some blurring, but picture quality is generally better.
- A field still shows less picture information so it may be rougher, but there is no blurring.

### Linear PCM (LPCM)

These are uncompressed digital signals. CDs are recorded with 44.1 kHz/16 bit PCM, while DVDs use PCM between 48 kHz/16 bit and 96 kHz/24 bit, allowing playback with greater quality sound.

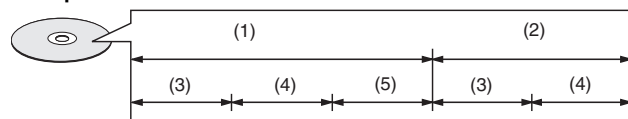
The linear PCM signals output from the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT OPTICAL terminal are stereo (2 channel).

LPCM sound is available when recording in XP mode.

### Title/Chapter (DVD-Video)

DVD-Video are divided into large sections (titles) and smaller sections (chapters). The numbers allocated to these sections are called title numbers and chapter numbers.

### MP3 (MPEG Audio Layer 3)

An audio compression method that compresses audio to approximately one tenth of its size without any considerable loss of audio quality. You can play MP3s you have recorded onto CD-R and CD-RW.

### Pan & Scan/Letterbox

In general, DVD-Video are produced with the intention that they be viewed on a widescreen TV (16:9 aspect ratio), so images often don't fit regular (4:3 aspect ratio) TVs. Two styles of picture, "Pan & Scan" and "Letterbox", deal with this problem.

**Pan & Scan:** The sides are cut off so the picture fills the screen.



**Letterbox:** Black bands appear at the top and bottom of the picture so the picture itself appears in an aspect ratio of 16:9.



### Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus.

(This unit is compatible with version 2.0 and 1.1.)

### Progressive/Interlace

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P.

Using progressive output, you can enjoy the high-resolution video recorded on media such as DVD-Video.

Your TV must be compatible to enjoy progressive video.

### Protection

You can prevent accidental erasure by setting writing protection or erasure protection.

### Sampling frequency

Sampling is the process of converting the heights of sound wave (analog signal) samples taken at set periods into digits (digital encoding). Sampling frequency is the number of samples taken per second, so larger numbers mean more faithful reproduction of the original sound.

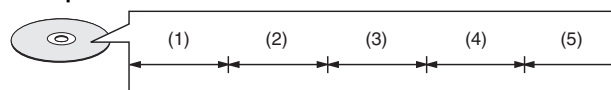
### VBR (Variable Bitrate)

This is a method of video recording that adjusts the bit rate according to video signal.

### Track

This is the smallest division on CD and Video CD.

La grabación temporizada de programas TV no puede ejecutarse en DVD y VHS conjuntamente.

Verifique si el tiempo inicial de la grabación temporizada no se superpone en la pantalla de programación temporizada tanto del DVD (→ arriba) como del VHS (→ 83).

Cuando se superponen los ajustes de la grabación temporizada:

- Cuando están especificados los canales del sintonizador en la grabación temporizada tanto en el VHS como en el DVD, sólo podrá tener comienzo una grabación temporizada.

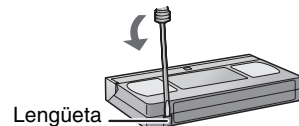

## Reproducción repetida

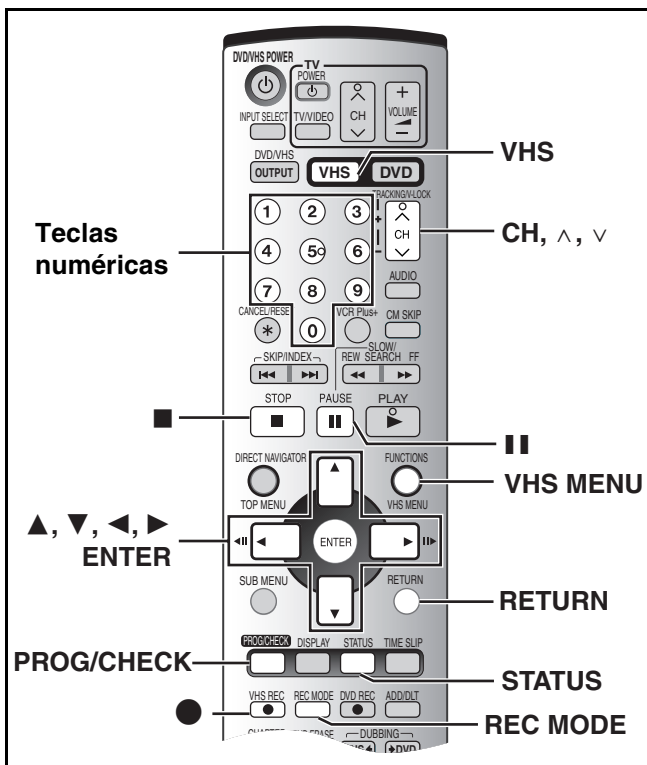

### Velocidad de la cinta

SP: Puede grabar la longitud señalada en la cinta.

EP: Tres veces la longitud del modo SP.

VP: Cinco veces la longitud del modo SP.

- Para conseguir una duración de grabación más larga, seleccione "EP" o "VP".
- Si la calidad de la imagen es importante para Ud. o bien si quiere almacenar la cinta durante un largo período, seleccione "SP".
